BE AN ELMER - IT'S A GOOD THING!

ORP With John Shannon K3WWP

A couple of issues ago I asked you to tell me about your most memorable QRP QSO, and I would tell you about mine. It is very hard to decide on just one.

I guess when you work the last of something, like the 50thstate - or the first of something, like the 1st Asia QSO - thoseare ones that stick in our minds.

I remember working 4Z4DX on 30M one evening for my firstever QSO with Asia, and my last continent. Another Asian OSOsticks in my mind - the first time I ever worked Japan. Here is the country with the most amateurs in the world, and I justcouldn't work it, mainly because of the difficult path thatpasses through the auroral zone. Finally in the CQ WW DX contestin 1996, I made it. What a thrill to have JA3ZOH come back to me, and getting his QSL in just a couple of weeks. First QSO's on a particular band are also memorable. Iremember well working K3KLC on 160M. I never thought you could doanything with QRP on that band, but I was wrong. I now have 40states there. I also remember my first QSO on 12M with KOOSW. Iremember that one because 12M was the last of the HF bands that Igot on, and that one meant I now had QRP QSO's on all 9 HF bands.

My most memorable QSO of all came on 30M. On May 10, 1996 at 0036Z in the evening I was just calling my usual 3 X 2 CQ tryingto get my QSO for that day keeping my streak of days with atleast 1 QRP QSO going. After a few tries, a weak signal answered me. The call started with a V so I immediately thought it must be VE6 or VE7, but the second letter wasn't an E or an A, it was aK. Well, I figured now it had to be an Aussie maritime mobilesomewhere. No, he didn't sign slant anything after the call, justVK6HQ. I still couldn't believe it, and thought it was someonejust fooling around. I went through with the QSO, and he wascopying me very well, maybe a little better than I was copyinghim in my excitement. He gave his QTH as near Perth which I knewwas in western Australia, and just about as far from my QTH ascould be and still be on the Earth. We exchanged info for a fewminutes, and said 73's. Now I wondered if it was legitimate.

I got my QSL in the mail the next day with an SAE and anIRC, and waited. In about a week or 10 days, I got a card backfrom John, and I knew then I had made a QRP QSO halfway aroundthe world. There is a possibility the QSO was long path whichwould even add a little more to the distance that my signals travelled.

That's my most memorable one till something better comesalong, and I doubt it will. I'd still like to hear about yours.

As we start the new year (it's Jan 3rd as I'm writing this), I'd like to say how gratifying it is to hear about all the QRPoperation that is being done by FISTS members. In every issue of the Keynote, there are many mentions of QRP. If you are a newmember of FISTS who is interested in QRP, and would like to readsome of my past columns, they are all available on my web site athttp://www.geocities.com/CapeCanaveral/3852/ There are many awards available for QRP operation. Our ownFISTS club has two very fine awards, the QRP Century (I have # 001). With the large number of FISTS now running QRP, these should be easier andeasier to eam.

Several of the major awards are also honored with a QRPendorsement. The Worked All States from ARRL has such anendorsement, and is fairly easy to earn. It's an attractive awardmade even more so with the QRP sticker on it. Another popularaward is Worked All Continents from the IARU and the ARRL. It is available from the ARRL, and can be endorsed for QRP operation.

One big award that is not endorsed for QRP is the DXCC. Why,I don't know. I have heard that ARRL has no way of proving thatyou actually operated QRP for the DXCC. Yet, they believe you forWAS and WAC. To use a currently popular phrase - go figure!

Of course, the QRP ARCI has many awards for QRP, as do someof the other QRP clubs. There are also other organizations that issue QRP awards. If you would like a listing of just about everyham radio award there is, you can contact my friend, K1BV whom lhave known since the 60's when he was K1GUD, and we were involved in the county hunter's net together. FISTS QSL Bureau

Thought I'd respond to some of the questions which have been E-mailed to me or enclosed with the SASE's and/or cards we have received.

Can I send you cards for QSO's with DX FISTS members?

Yes sir, echoing what George said in his ODDS N' ENDS column in the last Issue (12), send these cards to us. We periodically make a mailing to Bob Lowe, the OM who runs the FISTS QSL Bureau in England, of all the QSL's for DX stations on that side of the Atlantic.

Since we took over the Bureau, I've made mailings to Bob on: October 20, November 17, December 9 and December 30. So the cards will get over there pretty soon after I get them. Generally it takes 5-8 days to get from Moneta, VA to Bolton, England.

How about Canadian FISTS and DX FISTS on this side of the Atlantic?

We handle sending cards to these FISTS members. We do get SAE's from Canadians sometimes with U.S. stamps (if they can get them) or funds with which we can purchase U.S. stamps. Generally we get SAE's with IRC's from DX stations on this side of the Atlantic.

Should I send separate SASE's for my new call and my previous call?

No, you don't have to. But if you don't, please include both calls in the upper left hand corner of each SASE.

What should I put in the "return address" position on the SASE?

Please put your call sign in large letters in the normal return address position. We will put the FISTS QSL Bureau address below it. I generally stamp this address on when I get your SASE. If you want to use one of your return address labels, I suggest you put it on the flap on the rear of the envelope.

What is the number someone has put in the bottom left hand corner of my SASE?

I'm the "someone" who puts the number on your SASE. It's a sequential number starting with #1 on the first SASE we receive. I hope it helps you know how many cards are still in the Bureau. When we send out your last envelope we will note on the flap or in a note inside the envelope that it is: "The last envelope in Bureau"

How much postage should I put on the SASE?

For U.S. stations, one 32 cent stamp is needed for the first ounce. We can generally enclose 7 QSL cards in this envelope. Each additional ounce requires 23 cents more postage. So, for 55 cents postage we can generally send 15 QSL cards. For 78 cents postage we can generally send 23 QSL cards, Etc. If you put more than 32 cents on your SASE we will generally wait until there are cards roughly equivalent to the postage attached.

Can I have cards sent periodically?

Yes, just indicate next to your call sign how often you want us to send back your envelope, such as: (Monthly) or (5 cards). We will not send back an empty envelope - Hi!

To whom should I make out a check or money order if I send funds to the Bureau?

If you send money to the bureau, please make the checks out to Stan Reas, not FISTS CW Club or Franklin ARC. There isn't enough income to justify opening a checking account in FISTS name down near Stan's QTH, so Stan can't cash them. He has to send them to WZ8C, who in turn has to cash it then mail the funds back.

If you have additional questions as to how we are running your QSL Bureau let me know.

Chuck, **KB2E**, sends along these comments on the Dec Keynote article in which John, **K5DL** spoke about the other "auxiliary" characters used in Morse code that we don't ordinarily use.

"I remember when I first learned Morse making a list of the "missing" characters and wondering why they were missing. John mentions that there are six, but a very interesting book by Lewis Coe, called "Wireless Radio" lists seven, or maybe it's 12 if you count an additional five that are used in Russian, and use the Cyrillic alphabet. The six -- and I am not up to speed on the names of the punctuation that accompanies each letter, terms such as diacritical mark or umlaut or accent grave are just dim memories - are the German A with two dots over it, dit-dah-dit-dah; the Spanish-Scandinavian A, with an accent mark, or a dot, over it, dit-dah-dah-dit-dah; the German-Spanish CH, dah-dah-dah, the French E with an accent over it, dit-dit-dah-dit-dit, the Spanish N with that wavy line over it that we all know now because of the infamous El Nino, dah-dah-dit-dah-dah; the German O with two dots over it, dah-dah-dah-dit; and the German U with two dots over it, dit-dit-dah-dah. I won't attempt to describe the Russian characters -even if I had them right in front of me, if I was working a Russian ham I wouldn't dare send them for fear they might be shorthand for "your mother wears Army boots."

"(Years ago when Kruschev was being such a pain and bullying our statesmen, one of our guys -if not Dean Rusk, I'm close -- said to him, as Kruschev was being polite to the statesman and blaspheming the USA, "Remember the old Russian proverb, 'Don't praise me and spit on my mother,' and Kruschev said oh yes, sorry, I remember -- and our statesman had made it up! Hi!)

"Coe's book "Wireless Radio" hasn't gotten much attention, but it is a GEM, succinctly and informatively written. It's not just ham radio, but most hams would find it extremely interesting. Chapter heads include marine radio, amateur radio, point to point, on the move, military radio, cellular and satellite telephones, TV, police radio, wireless transmission of power, the Morse code, radar, and a couple of more.

I enjoyed that book so much I bought another one by him "The Telegraph, a history of Morse's invention and its predecessors in the United States." The books are available from McFarland & Co., Jefferson, NC. The two I have are bound in homely but serviceable library bindings: don't be put off by their somewhat drab appearance. Recommended

An Indoor Antenna Idea

The December KeyNote contained a story about W8ROG and WO8E and their new condo and the antenna problem which Ken faces. I am an apartment dweller, too, and I know what he is up against. I live in a two-story building on the second floor of a 40-apartment complex and I have the distinct joy of listening to the horizontal deflection systems of 39 TV sets, assorted lamp dimmers, etc. It's not a great environment in which to operate. Further, we are not allowed any outside wires, even though I could string up about 150 feet of wire.

With the violent thunderstorms we have around here, I wouldn't want to be responsible for bringing some lightning into the building - might result in having to live on the street! So a couple years ago I set out to see what I could build to operate right in this bedroom. I finally came up with a half-wave loop for 20 meters. This antenna takes very little space, is fed with balanced feed line (no ground problems and "hot" equipment) and is quite efficient on 20 meters. It is usable on 40 and some other bands.

The basic half-wave loop is directional in its own plane - thus a half-wave horizontal loop is horizontally directive, unlike a full-wave loop which is directional perpendicular to its plane. In practice, the half-wave loop does show a slight azimuthal directivity in the direction opposite to the fed side, but this is only 2 or 3 dB.

This antenna is built from four pieces of 1/2x 1/2 x 1/16 aluminum angle, 8 feet long, available at most hardware stores. The four sides are bolted together in a square pattern, with the fed side split in the middle for a feed by open wire line. The insulator here was made from a piece of 1/2-inch thick polyethylene cut from a kitchen cutting board. The antenna itself is hung from my bedroom ceiling using some plastic chain links found at a crafts store. I chose aluminum for its light weight, since the mounting to the ceiling is tricky if the weight is too great. I would have preferred copper tubing except for its weight. Each of the four corners is electrically reinforced with a 1/2 inch length of some 1 x 1 x 1/16 aluminum angle to provide extra conductivity to assure low resistance at each joined corner, extra important if 40-meter use is intended. Thus, each corner contains three bolts and nuts, one for joining the antenna elements and two more for the overlapping 1 x 1 angle. The antenna is suspended from the bedroom ceiling in seven places. If enough people are interested, I can supply some sketches of how I did it - it's really quite simple.

The antenna is fed with balanced line from a

tuner. This assures balanced feed currents and no residual RF wandering around on equipment cabinets. On 20 meters it presents a fairly high impedance to the tuner (as expected), and thus its efficiency is quite high. The RF losses in the antenna are very low. As for performance, I seem to be able to work anything I can hear on 20M and usually get reports that are equal to the report I give. The only problem is that I cannot operate my computer while on the air. At 100 watts, the RF field from the antenna is too intense and is only five feet above my keyboard and gets into the keyboard, generating about 18 interrupts per second until the stack overflows and the machine goes away. Fortunately, my little Super CMOS II keyer works just fine in this RF environment with no problems.

The antenna will load on 40 but is very inefficient. This loop is a quarter wave long on 40 and thus is a virtual short circuit (about 5 ohms or so). This is the reason for the corner reinforcement pieces. But it does get out in a ho-hum manner. I have worked KH6 on 40, however, so all is not lost. It will load nicely on the higher bands, but one must remember as you go up to the higher frequencies the directivity of the antenna changes until on 10 meters it is radiating straight up and down - not too useful. As a space-saving antenna, this one is a beaut - how many people use their ceiling for anything?

My best to you and the great FISTS gang, and may "98 be great". Tom, W1GO

SWR

Last month Jim K5JAZ wrote an article about setting up a station on a budget using a vertical antenna. Here is an explanation from Phil, KE3FL, about the SWR Jim reported with the antenna:

Jim set up his vertical and measured 2:1 on all bands. Then he moved his measurement to the shack and measured 1.3:1 on all bands and stated, "I don't know why, and don't really care,..."

Well, I agree and disagree. I agree that it won't change things now and so one doesn't need to care. He made sure his SWR was the required "2:1" in the antenna's specs, as measured at the antenna. And yes, the presence of his body in the near-field will make a difference. My small article just below his demonstrates another possibility, his 50 feet of coax. To find out just which contributes more, let's crunch the numbers...

Let's start with a feed line loss of -0.6 dB and a measurement of 1.3:1 SWR at the shack. What do the numbers say the SWR at the antenna will be? I

get only 1.35:1, even if we up the feed-line loss to - 1.2 dB I only get an SWR at the antenna of 1.42:1 so the explanation is NOT 50 feet of good feed-line.

Jim is getting some very good SWR's from that antenna, and there are times when we should be concerned with SWR readings better than the manufacturer's specs. Let us all remember that one also gets very good SWR's from a good dummy load, but then we don't get DX QSO's with a dummy load, HI. The proof is in the pudding, and Jim's QSO's prove that the antenna is working well! Good article Jim, thanks! 73 de KE3FL Phil Karras

Holes In Plexiglass

In issue #8 K8UGL mentions using a heated awl or ice pick to melt holes in plastic. I just wanted him and others to know that there are special drill bits made for plexiglass. "In 37 years of pounding brass, I never acquired the proper touch for a keyer nor one those typewriter like buttons devices that enter data to a computer. John, **WA2NZO**, #3684 48th AHC/USARVN '66

I wrote back to John and asked him for details about the QSO, if he remembered if it was QRQ or QRS, QRM, etc. He replied:

"Never really checked my speed because band conditions, fatigue, and an incoming signal work to throttle my fist. Only once did I forsake slow speed to run wildly with the demon key they call Speed-X. It started out as one of those god-awful nights filled with a stillness on 40 and 20. I flipped to 15 when all of a sudden the ether exploded with a loud CQ. He was fast and you could tell by his rhythm that a keyer formed his characters."

"Bored from the stillness before and knowing that this was the best the evening had to offer, I slowly answered his call. He acknowledged me and said that I had reached a Naval Air Station. I tapped out my reply suggesting that he slow down to swap more information. He returned like a crusty old crab ordering me to send at his speed or terminate the contact. I rigidly fixed my fingers on the knob of that straight key and spat upon its bearings to get more WPM. If he sent at 25, I pounded back with 27. We dueled on until there was nothing more to send while listeners eased back on their eardrums that were stretched out to tell the difference between the keyer and the straight key called Speed-X.

What a neat way to describe a QSO John, I could almost feel like I was there! Thanks for sharing.

As most of already know, GB ceased its watch on the 500 kHz international (CW) distress frequency at midnight last night, 31st December 1997.

I patched a cassette recorder into my FT900 tuned to 500 kHz and have just transcribed the following......

(at 2349 UTC Portpatrick Radio GPK was first to sign off)

CQ CQ de GPK GPK. At 31.2359 UTC Portpatrick Radio/GPK will end the H24H 500kHz distress watch after 76 years. In 1844 QTC nr 1 fm Samuel Morse was <What hath God wrought?>. All R/Os now ken the answer to this. NW 73 73 /Slainte to all R/Os, past and present - fare well. AR de GPK GPK VA

(next was Wick Radio/GKR)

CO CO CO de GKR GKR GKR. After almost 90 vears serving seafarers this is the final w/t broadcast from Wick Radio. For the few of us who are left it is with feelings of pride and nostalgia we remember friends and colleagues at sea and ashore and the service was rendered particularly to the then mighty distant water fishing fleet. Technology however marches on and as we find ourselves and our service consigned if not to the museum then certainly to the pages of history. All that remains..... < at this point a strong TFC broadcast from IAR (!) rendered copy impossible>best wishes for 1998 and 73s to any who are left on the sea with the ability to read this<at this point GLD transmitted an acknowledgment to GKR before the latter had finished sending - I think he was trying to hurry things along!>

CQ CQ CQ de GCC GCC. Here is the last w/t transmission from GCC. A fond farewell from Geordy-land. Sent with a sad and shaking hand. For many years with signs we spoke and now it all goes up in smoke. So thanks and all the very best as GCC is laid to rest. De GCC/GND 010000Z AR AR BB de GND

(Finally, at approx 0017 UTC)

GLD de GCC. Over to you and best wishes to u and all listeners AR VA de GLD R Mni tks.

CQ CQ de GLD GLD. This is the final w/t transmis-

sion from Lands End Radio. Since 1901 GLD has listened continuously on 500 kHz and is proud to have assisted many ships in distress both in peace time and in war. But now the time has come - ours is not to reason why - the satellites are calling, our Morse transmitters die. Marconi if you can hear us we salute you. de GLD 31/12/97 2359z AR AR de GLD

My tape ran out at about 0030z when GLD was still acknowledging calls from other watchkeepers. Callsign logged included EAC, EAS EJK, EJM, IAR, OST, OXZ, SAA, SPA, SPE and VCM.

Thus another era comes to an end. The Morse was all hand sent and frequently showed the emotion of the occasion. Vy 73 and HNY to all, Chris G3TUX

Robert KB7AQD comments: Sounds like the maritime version of Michael Crichton's "Westworld" and "Jurassic Park". As long as all the high tech rigs work PERFECTLY, ships are safe. But, as we radio amateurs know, nothing works perfectly, especially during a disaster.

This provides a great chance to promote FISTS and CW operations. FISTS with 500 kHz receive capabilities should take a few minutes a night on top of the hour to DX on 500 kHz CW. Send each ship and shore station a QSL report letting them know that someone else is indeed listening.

Some of our FISTS homebrewers and kitmakers may want to design a portable "Field Day" style 500 kHz IC receiver with a small loop antenna and a narrow CW passband so that we can go on 500 kHz DX peditions to monitor the routine traffic and - I hope -- rare distress call. It takes no license to monitor, and we could assist in discovering a weak call for help, and relay the sad news to the proper authorities.

Along this same topic is a proposal written by Greg **W8XP**:

At the outset amateur radio was given radio spectrum to use for the good of everyone. From that simple gift an incredible communications infrastructure arose. With only a small outlay of time and money by the federal government and the people of this country, guidelines were set and formed operating rules. Now a small portion of the FCC's budget is used in the name of amateur radio to administer those frequencies. Beyond that, the balance of money, time, and experimentation is spent by the individuals who participate in amateur radio. It is mind boggling to think

of the size of this incredible communications miracle, with all it has to offer. Literally everyone wins, the participants and the public alike.

My proposal is, for bands that will retain the use of CW and other digital modes for emergency communications, primarily for what has been lost at 500 kHz serving maritime emergency traffic. I propose 2 new bands in the HF spectrum; 1 in the vicinity of 5 MHz and the other at about 12 MHz. The propagation characteristics of these 2 bands should supply long and short range communications 24 hours a day. The higher frequency will also allow for smaller antennas that can be used more readily in portable and mobile applications. If amateurs can have access to frequencies that will also be used by maritime, these frequencies will be monitored continually for emergency distress signals.

Using CW on these bands will once again provide the one basic mode of communication that has proven itself for over 90 years in sending and receiving distress signals to someone who can help. CW is the one mode that will get a signal out with the minimum amount of equipment and power source, which in some emergency situations minimal equipment and power is the only thing left to use. Digital modes could also be used to attain a volume of information where needed or desired, while still keeping the bandwidth and power requirements to a minimum. The fact that the most basic of radios can be used with the natural ionosphere to bounce the signals back to earth at very low power settings, makes this an extremely reliable and timeless way to save lives and property. It will also be an additional incentive for more of the amateur community to participate and advance with these modes of communication. In addition to that, equipment, antennas, and propagation of these frequencies will be explored to the extreme.

For all the nations and corporations that provide for the monitoring of emergency traffic, this proposal should give them a mechanism to fill any potential gaps that may come to light in their infrastructure. Of course it will be kept on an amateur level with regard to no commercial traffic being passed on these new bands. In a world where liability concerns are paramount, this would be a huge asset for everyone concerned. The world is becoming a very busy place with many lives to protect, many additional environmental concerns. This makes it easy to embrace additional protection. Think of this proposal as a free insurance policy. Keep in mind this is not a primary source of communications. Just like all other amateur traffic, the amateur radio operator's job to handle emergency traffic begins when the primary communication infrastructure cannot do it's job. It would be the same for these new bands.

To achieve this new additional coverage it will require only a few hundred kHz for each band that I propose. This is the same proven process that gave us today's amateur radio infrastructure. Just think of the new international friendships and trusts that will be established in the process of operating and establishing these new bands. Greg W8XP FISTS #1977

Fiction or Forecast By Ed NC5S

Please don't take this as another biased and rabid argument for (or against) continuing the Morse code requirement. This is not meant to be more vitriol. I am just trying to prepare all us practitioners of the dark art of CW to accept the inevitable. After all, Morse code is pretty old-fashioned technology. It is an arcane art mastered by only an elite few. There are many more efficient modes than CW, and CW holds back the progress of Ham Radio technology since it doesn't require upgraded protocols and hardware/software implementation every few years. It is not fair to force those with no interest in this outdated art to master a skill that it literally takes weeks of hard study to learn.

A lot of new hams are intimidated by the code, realizing what a useless but insurmountable obstacle it is, and so the code requirement has not only kept new blood from getting into the hobby, but it has also kept Technicians with a lot of time and money invested in Amateur Radio from progressing. We need new blood into the hobby, and we can't afford to let us elitist traditionalists stand in the way of progress. I therefore back down from my previous position that the CW requirement must stay in effect. However, we must prepare ourselves for the consequences of dropping CW.

When (not "IF"... the day will come. the question is WHEN) the code requirement is abolished, how many new hams will bother to learn the code? About the same number who build their own rigs now, i think. After 15 or 20 years, the majority of even Extra class licensees will be no-coders. Once they are a not so silent majority, somebody is gonna wake up to the situation with the overcrowded fone bands vs the still peaceful non-fone bands and say "Hey! That outmoded old CW stuff went out the window back when the Coast Guard stopped guarding 500Kc! The FCC finally acknowledged it when they dropped the code requirement and I could get a license, too. We still got these old foot-dragging, progress-hating brassmashers hogging up all the good spectrum. Let's get it!" Then the feds will bow to popular opinion and open all the bands up to fone ops once and for all. After all, the majority will be in favor of it, and treaties be damned. I am uncomfortable with the idea of hearing fone guys complaining about my beedly-beeps interfering with their QSO on 14010. But I guess I'll just have to roll with the tide and become a mic worshipper too. I'll make a nice plaque for mounting my favorite key on. It will make a nice display, adding a touch of old-fashioned charm to the shack.

With the bands completely opened up, I predict an increase in the number of ops who memorized the questions to pass their license exam and really don't know too much except maybe where the band edges are and how to trim a dipole. When we have reached this point, by and large we WILL be just cb-ers who can install our own equipment without help.

When we have reached THIS point, may as well not have an exam at all. Many clear thinkers of that day to come will insist that the testing requirement is totally irrelevant, as are multiple classes of license, since anybody can memorize enough to pass whatever level of license they desire. The majority will see the logic, and the feds will be forced to act again for the betterment of the hobby after dragging their foot for a few years. RTTY, AMTOR, Packet, and all the other data modes along with CW transmissions, will be outlawed. Data is more efficiently transmitted over the internet anyway, and the modes will just require too many old-fashioned, antiquated skills. Finally, all those interfering "beedle-beedlebeedle" and cricket chirping sounds will be eliminated, and it will be just talk, talk, talk. That complicated stuff has no more relevance in modern communications than spark! Want nostalgia? Get a jungle drum.

Mail-in no-test licensing will be convenient, and popular, and will bring in hundreds of thousands of new hams. Finally, the amateur bands are almost as free as God intended them to be! Freedom to express yourself, freedom of speech, long repressed on the bands, will be joyously celebrated by the downtrodden who have fought all the long years to throw off the heavy hand of the FCC and those hateful, elitist pro-exam nuts. The QRP homebrewer fanatics will be silenced by a very sensible law requiring all equipment used on the air be type-accepted, i.e. made in a factory where the manufacturer can ensure that no skill is needed to get on the air and talk, talk, talk. Band selection should be automatic, and power level set at the maximum the built-in power supply can handle. An HF all-bander will have a thousand preset simplex channels for the auto-propagation channelpicker-outer to choose from. The only user-adjustable control will be the on/off switch, the "volume" knob,

and the push-buttons for background music and sound effects.

Finally the big day will come. The courts will recognize that everybody, licensed or not, is entitled to equal use of the amateur bands. FCC licenses will continue to be proudly displayed by the old-timers who had to take a 10 question true/false test to earn them. The same old-timers will collect such curiosities as Voltmeters, grid dip meters, oscilloscopes, soldering irons, and the like, and as they die the newest craze, collecting antique ham gear from the prefreedom days will take off. The FCC, in alarm, will impose heavy fines on possession of old fully useradjustable transceivers and transmitters that have not had their finals removed and connectors filled with a type-accepted epoxy based compound at an authorized factory.

New employment opportunities will open up for practitioners of the dark arts. There will be a big demand for technicians who know how to plug everything together and make it work. These radio experts will take care of all the really mysterious stuff like installing a station GND, whatever the hell that stands for, and connecting an antenna properly. Once the radio nerd is done, paid, and gone, the proud station owner will have a station capable of transmitting a signal clear to the other side of the globe... of course with all the QRM nobody will understand the words, but it will still be comforting to know that one's voice can help contribute to the joyous unintelligible babble all the way in Ulan Bator. Radio will truly be making the world a smaller, friendlier place!

Finally, the day will come when some ham, browsing through an antique ham radio shoppe will see a dusty old set, one of the really old ones ordered disabled by the FCC because the continuously variable tuning permitted off-channel transmission. The ham of the day will notice an opening on the back panel cryptically labeled "KEY", and wonder why the ancient, long dead owner though it was necessary to lock up his AB.
