HOW DO I JOIN?

Membership is open to all people interested in Morse code, irrespective of their speed and ability. An application form is not necessary to join, but it gives us a more complete picture of our membership. You can download a North American membership application on the FISTS web page: http://www.fists.org. An application can be mailed to you. Send a message Jim Ranieri, AA9LS, aa9ls@turbotoads.com and he will email it to you, or mail an SASE to him at 33778 Rebecca Rd, Kingston IL 60145 and Jim will send you an application via return postal mail. To join without an application, send your name, call, and mailing address with your membership fee to Nancy WZ8C, PO Box 47, Hadley, MI 48440 (checks payable to FISTS). To join using Paypal (www.paypal.com), send the funds to fists@tir.com. In the comments box, type NEW MEMBERSHIP, your callsign, name and mailing address if different from your Paypal address.

HOW MUCH DOES IT COST?

Subscriptions are \$15.00/year; Under 18= FREE; College students = \$10. Family members may join FISTS at no extra charge-only one newsletter is mailed per household. Please make checks paypable to FISTS CW Club and send to FISTS, P O Box 47, Hadley, MI 48440. Do not send FISTS correspondence to Nancy WZ8C's callbook address. Checks can take 6-8 weeks to clear from the day received. It does NOT take 8 weeks to get your number, it just may take that long for your check to clear.

WHAT IF I AM A MEMBER UNDER 18 or OVER 79?

To continue a teen (17-) or old-timer membership (80+), you must notify WZ8C of your continued interest in FISTS, renewals are not automatic.

HOW DO I JOIN USING MY PAYPAL ACCOUNT?

North American FISTS accepts PAYPAL (http://www.paypal.com). Address your PAYPAL payment to FISTS@TIR.COM To join via Paypal, type "New Membership" in the Paypal Comments Box, your name (if different from the name on your Paypal account), callsign, and mailing address.

HOW DO I GET A NUMBER FOR MY LOCAL CLUB?

Clubs with FCC call signs may be assigned a FISTS number at no charge providing there is at least one FISTS member in good standing in the local club. These clubs are not legally affiliated with FISTS, nor does FISTS have anything to do with how the club is run, etc. It just means the club has a FISTS number and is worth three points toward awards. If the club wants a newsletter, there is a \$15 a year charge. To defray costs, please enclose \$3 when a club applies for an award and wants a certificate. There is no charge for a Century Certificate number, just for the certificate if one is desired. Membership certificates are \$1 for clubs.

HOW DO I RENEW?

We try to send out renewal postcards, but if you renew prior to your renewal month it will save postage and printing costs as well as volunteer time. Your renewal date is on your Keynote mailing label - sometimes in the format of year, month, date. For example 2005/4/4 would be a renewal date April 2005. The date of the month is meaningless, but the computer program requires a date, so generally the date of the month is the same as the month. 2005/12/12; 2006/5/5 etc. RENEWALS ARE FREE FOR AGES 80 AND UP & 17 AND YOUNGER.

HOW DO I RENEW?

To renew, send \$15/year to Nancy WZ8C (checks paypable to FISTS) at FISTS, PO Box 47 Hadley MI 48440 or via Paypal to fists@tir.com.

HOW DO I RENEW WITH PAYPAL?

If you have a Paypal account, send the funds to fists@tir.com; put "RENEWAL" in the Note Box, along with your callsign.

MAY I RENEW FOR MORE THAN ONE YEAR AT A TIME?

Yes! You may renew for as many years at a time as you like, but there is not a 'quantity' discount.

MY MEMBERSHIP LAPSED, CAN I GET MY OLD NUMBER BACK?

Yes - numbers are not reassigned. If you have had a number in the past, please let Nancy WZ8C know at the time of your renewal. so she can 'reactivate' it. If a new number is issued by mistake, it will be corrected and you will have your old number reactivated, but you have to notify WZ8C.

LISTS, ROSTERS, EMAIL LISTS and THE FISTS REFLECTOR

HOW DO I UPDATE MY ADDRESS or CALL SIGN ON THE FISTS DATABASE?

Send corrections or changes to Nancy Kott, WZ8C, at FISTS, P. O. Box 47, Hadley, MI 48440 or email to nancy@tir.com. Please send labels with your corrections to the FISTS QSL Bureau so the bureau workers don't have to change all your SASEs by hand.

HOW DO I GET A PRINTED UP-TO-DATE MEMBER LIST?

Lists of active members are available updated quarterly and available for printing from the FISTS Web page. The search engine feature on the main web page is updated more frequently than the text list on the web page, but only includes North American members.

HOW DO I GET ON THE FISTS EMAIL LIST or EMAIL REFLECTOR?

To receive periodic official Email updates, send your Email address, call sign and FISTS number to Nancy WZ8C nancy@tir.com. If you put your email address on your application, it is automatically added to the list. Due to potential spam problems, the list is not given out to the membership and is not published on the web page. It is only used to notify you of FISTS items of interest. If you want people

There is also a FISTS reflector you can join on your own at http://www.mailman.qth.net. Search down the list on the left until you see Directory of Lists, then FISTS, then follow the instructions.

HOW DO I ORDER FISTS CLUB QSL CARDS, ID BADGES, MUGS, ETC?

Several private vendors have FISTS logo badges, cards, mugs, buttons, etc available. Check our web page http://www.fists.org under "other ham links" for information.

HOW DO I IMPROVE MY CODE SPEED and MEET LOTS OF NEW FRIENDS?

Join FISTS! Get involved in the nets and activities! Volunteer to be a Code Buddy! Write an article for the Keynote about your interests!

HOW DO I GET A COPY OF THE K7QO CODE COURSE?

FISTS makes this wonderful course available (V3 is the latest and is MP3 only, you must have an MP3 player or computer). To obtain your copy send \$1 per disk to cover the postage and envelope and include a label with your address, if possible, to FISTS PO Box 47, Hadley MI 48440.

Chuck Adams, K7QO, has also put the General Exam written question pool on CD in Morse code, starting out slowly and working up to about 20 wpm. It's not a beginner CD because it doesn't have the letter repetition, but it is excellent practice for those who know the code and want to upgrade their skills, and a good refresher for those who have been licensed a while. You may obtain a copy of this disk for \$1, including envelope and postage (include an address label if possible) from FISTS, PO Box 47, Hadley MI 48440.

Beginner's Guide to the FISTS QSL Bureau

Basically the QSL Bureau works like this: You pack up all your QSL cards for contacts with other FISTS members and send them to us. We sort the cards and put them in the Self Addressed Stamped Envelopes (SASE's) which the members have sent to us. When we get 6 or 7 cards in an SASE with one ounce postage on it we mail them.

The mailing address for the Bureau is:

FISTS QSL Bureau c/o Stan Reas - K4UK 1020 Long Island Drive Moneta, VA 24121

So, to get the cards which are sent via the Bureau for you, you need SASEs on file with us. We suggest a minimum of three SASEs be sent. We require envelopes which are at least 4-1/8" high and much prefer the #10 Business Size envelope (4-1/8" x 9-1/2") which will work for nearly all QSL card sizes.

The smaller personal-size envelope $(3-5/8" \times 6-1/2")$ will not handle the large QSL cards which some members send and will no longer be accepted. (See reason below "Sample")

Some of the members send $6" \times 9"$ kraft envelopes which can handle all cards sizes I've ever seen. If you can find the $5" \times 7"$ kraft envelopes they are a really nice size for SASEs

Your SASE should have at least one ounce postage (44 cents) in the upper right hand corner. Your address goes in the normal address portion of the envelope and put your call in LARGE letters in the upper left hand corner. We will stamp the lower left hand corner of each of your SASE's:

ENVELOPE_	OF
SASE LEFT_	

This will indicate which envelope is being used and how many are left on hand.

We will include a "Last Envelope in Bureau" note when we have used your last envelope to send cards to you. Also, if the numbers in the bottom left hand corner indicates: for example: "Envelope # 3 of 3" - it will have been your last envelope. When you send in additional cards you can then send in additional SASE's.

Based on the weight of my QSL card per the scales in the Moneta, Virginia Post Office per the rates which are in effect as of May 11, 2009 we can send the following number of cards per weight:

Weight	Postage	Cards
1 ounce	44 cents	7
2 ounce	61 cents	15
3 ounce	78 cents	23

If we get a large amount of cards for you, we may put them all in the one envelope and add postage as required from our "stamp kitty." We appreciate your reimbursing the kitty with your next batch of cards.

If you put more than 44 cents postage on your SASEs, we will wait until we get the number of cards equivalent to the postage before mailing. Let us know if If you prefer periodic mailings.

You can send QSLs for contacts with all foreign FISTS members to us and we will forward them to Chuck Spence, M0AVW in England or Nigel Hardy, ZL2TX in New Zealand or "Harry" Shibata - JL3AMK in Japan. These chaps handle the distribution of QSL cards for overseas DX. We distribute cards for Canadian FISTS and other DX FISTS in North and South America directly from the Bureau.

So, send us your QSL cards and some SASEs and you're set up to use the Bureau. However, it won't do any good to send cards for contacts with stations who are not FISTS members as they won't have SASEs on file with us. Also, it is a good idea to confirm with the FISTS member that you will QSL via the Bureau. In that way both will know that there are SASEs at the Bureau.

If you send in a bunch of cards it would be appreciated if you sort the U.S. cards by call number. It speeds up the initial sort. But, you don't have to sort them alphabetically.

Eight volunteers - members of the Franklin County Amateur Radio Club of Rocky Mount, me, Stan K4UK, with the QSL Bureau. They do the final sorting and mailing of envelopes.

All costs involved in operating the QSL Bureau come from the club dues and donations from our members. We mail the DX cards to Chuck, M0AVW, in bulk and the cost has averaged 6 cents per card. Also we bulk mail the DX cards to Nigel, ZL2TX, for VK and ZL members and the cost has averaged 8.5 cents per card. The cards mailed to Harry, JL3AMK, for JA and BV members average 9.0 cents per card. So, if you send cards for DX members a donation would be appreciated! Your donation can be cash or checks. If checks, please make them out to "FISTS QSL Bureau" or to me, Stan Reas.

For Canadian and other non-U.S. members


Since all mail we send out from the Bureau must have U.S. postage stamps, you will have to put U.S. stamps on your SASEs. Obtaining U.S. stamps may be hard, if not impossible, so we suggest that you send SAEs (Self-Addressed-Envelopes) without stamps and some funds to cover the stamps we will obtain for you.

In order to minimize your costs, if you wish, we will accept mailing labels with your address on them in lieu of SAEs and will paste them on envelopes from our stock. Just include some funds with your labels to cover the stamps. Such funds can be "Green Stamps" (U.S. Dollars) or IRCs. If you prefer to send a check, please make them out to me, Stan Reas, or to "FISTS QSL Bureau" and use US funds.

Based on the weight of my QSL card at the Moneta, Virginia Post Office the following rates apply:

The reason for not accepting personal-size $(3-5/8" \times 6-1/2")$ envelopes:

Quite a few members are making their own QSL cards now-a-days. Often these are larger than the standard 3-1/2" x 5-1/2" dimension. Also quite a few of the cards from DX members are larger than the standard.

The small personal size envelope which is 3-5/8" x 6-1/2" can not accommodate these larger cards. My staff consists of all volunteers and they have become frustrated with trying to patch up the small envelopes to mail the larger cards. They are reluctant to fold the large cards

They have resorted to:

Cutting the front off of the small envelopes and taping it to a # 10 envelope

Taping paper to the flap and taping down the increased flap

Peeling stamps from the small envelopes and using rubber cement to paste them to a #10 envelope and writing the address on the #10 by hand

These volunteers do a great job helping me run the FISTS QSL Bureau. To alleviate frustration, we will no longer accept envelopes with height dimension less than 4-1/8" which is that of the #10 business-size envelope. That means we will not accept any personal-size (3-5/8" x 6-1/2") envelopes.

We much prefer the business-size envelope, which is 4-1/8" x 9-1/2" but will accept other envelopes which are at least 4-1/8" x 6" - such as the 6" x 9" and the 5" x 7" kraft envelopes.

If you live so far away from a store selling #10 business-size envelopes, we will accept mailing labels with your address on them and stamps or money in lieu of SASEs. We will put your labels and your stamps on #10 envelopes, which we will furnish from our stock.

FISTS Sprint Information

The following are the Official Rules for the FISTS SPRINT.

OBJECTIVE:

To exchange specified information with as many FISTS members as possible using Morse Code only, and within the time frame stipulated.

PARTICIPANTS:

Any properly licensed amateur radio operator, FISTS member or non-member is invited to take part in the contest. At least one of the two stations in each QSO must be a FISTS member.

DATE AND TIME: (subject to change, see main index page)

The Winter SPRINT will run from 1700 UTC to 2100 UTC on Second Saturday in February.

The Spring SPRINT will run from 1700 UTC to 2100 UTC on Second Saturday in May.

The Summer SPRINT will run from 2000 EDT to 2400 EDT on Second Friday in July.

The Fall SPRINT will run from 1700 UTC to 2100 UTC on Second Saturday in October.

BANDS:

Operation is limited to the following amateur bands: 3.5, 7, 14, 21, and 28 MHz amateur bands. Work stations only once per band.

ENTRY CLASSES:

There are three entry classes:

QRO: Over 5 watts -100 watts output power. 100 watts is the maximum output power allowed.

QRP: 5 watts output power or less.

Club: (regardless of power).

Entry class MUST be shown on logs to be considered for entry in a particular class, or will be assumed QRO.

An entry must be ONE class only, no combination of classes is allowed.

EXCHANGE:

The following information must be exchanged by both stations to count as a valid contest QSO:

For FISTS members:

RST, U.S. state/Canadian province/DXCC country, first name, FISTS number.

For non-FISTS members:

RST, U.S. state/Canadian province/DXCC country, first name, Power output.

DX COUNTRY STATUS:

U.S. states and Canadian provinces are those states and provinces that are contiguous and found within the North American continent. DX are those entities listed in the current ARRL DXCC publication, other than the above.

MULTIPLIERS:

Each U.S. State and Canadian province counts as 1 multiplier. Count each only once, no matter how many times worked.

Each DXCC entity counts as 1 multiplier. Count each no matter how many times worked.

SCORING:

Each QSO with a FISTS member: 5 points. Each QSO with a non-FISTS member: 2 points. Final score is total QSO points times multipliers.

CERTIFICATES:

U.S./VE:

Certificates will be awarded to the first, second, and third place finishers in each Entry Class.

LOG SUBMISSIONS:

Sending the logs is what counts, and they will be spot checked for accuracy and correct scoring procedures. All log entries must be received 30 days after the Sprint to be considered valid. Logs not sent to the proper address will not be considered for entry.

All logs MUST contain the following information to be considered for entry:;

Your name and call sign. Club name if entry is for a club. Your FISTS number if a member. Entry class. Your claimed score. List of claimed multipliers.

The entry form is the best way to record this information.

Download the entry form from the web page.

ELECTRONIC LOGS:

We will accept E-logs in standard Cabrillo format, or ascii text files. If your not sure about your format, please contact me before the contest entry deadline.

Get Your Feet Wet Weekend

Despite all the controversy about licensing and requirements, there are a lot of new hams who are intrigued with the code after passing their 5WPM.

But, like we all were (or are!), they are intimidated and nervous about getting on the air. They've had bad experiences on Field Day or other contests and QSO's where people won't QRS (slow down), and they are getting frustrated. We don't want that to happen! We want to encourage and nurture these new CW operators. The Novice RoundUp used to be a good forum for this, but the Novice concept is obsolete. Something needs to be implemented that would include all classes of newcomers and give them a friendly place to learn the ropes.

The 2010 Get Your Feet Wet Weekend will be 00:00Z Fri Sep 10, 2010 (Thursday local) to 00:00Z Sep 13 (Sunday local).

The focus is on sending slowly and clearly and sending the exchange in order. No memory or programable keyers or code readers are allowed - human-powered transmissions only. Certificates will

be sent out to the top three scorers in each category free of charge.

The rules: Operate under one of two categories for the entire event, Newcomer or Experienced. You can be licensed a long time but still be a Newcomer to CW or contesting. You're on the honor system: Choose whichever describes your ability.

Suggested calling frequencies are 3.558, 7.110, 14.110, 21.110, and 28.110. If you don't hear anyone, go ahead and call. Get your feet wet and jump in with a CQ FC on a clear frequency. YOU are there listening; chances are someone else is listening and waiting to hear a CQ, too.

Call CQ FC.

The Exchange: Callsign/N (newcomer) or Callsign/E (experienced), RST, Name, QTH, FISTS number or power, last two digits of the year licensed.

Example: WZ8C/E, 599, Nancy, MI, 0379, 88.

Count 2 points for working someone out of your category, 1 point for working someone in your category.

Multipliers are number of stations that were licensed during the last six years. For example in 2007, it would be stations licensed in 2002-2007, in year 2008 it would be stations licensed in 2003-2008, and so on.

Stations may be worked once per band for points, but their multiplier only counts once.

No WARC bands.

Contacts must be 2-way human-keyed CW (Iambics are fine - just no computerized or memory keyers).

Logs will be sent to Lee Hallin N7NU 3413 Walton Ln, Eugene OR 97408 or in ADIF format to hallinl@lanecc.edu within 30 days of the end of the event.

Logs and Summary pages can be downloaded from the web page http://www.fists.org

Excel spreadsheet available: If you want an Excel spreadsheet that will score GYFWW for you, send an email to Lee at hallinL@lanecc.edu indicating if you will be Newcomer or Experienced (so he can adjust the formulas) and your callsign. Lee will email a spreadsheet to you customized just for your callsign and entry class.

The International G3ZQS Memorial Straight Key Contest

The International G3ZQS Memorial Straight Key Contest will be 2300Z September 3, 2010 to 2300Z September 5, 2010. Everyone is welcome to participate, but only the logs of those using straight keys for all claimed contacts are eligible for awards.

BANDS:

Operation is limited to 3.5, 7, 14, 21, and 28 MHz amateur bands. No WARCs. Work stations only once per band.

ENTRY CLASSES:

There are three entry classes:

QRO: QRP: Club: Entry class MUST be shown on logs to be considered for entry in a particular class, or will be assumed QRO.

An entry must be ONE class only, no combination of classes is allowed.

CALL: CQ FS (short for fists straight = straight key)

EXCHANGE: RST, U.S. state/Canadian province/DXCC country, first name, FISTS number (or power output for non-FISTS).

MULTIPLIERS:

Each U.S. State and Canadian province counts as 1 multiplier. Count each only once, no matter how many times worked.

Each DXCC entity counts as 1 multiplier. Count each no matter how many times worked.

SCORING:

Each QSO with a FISTS member: 5 points.

Each QSO with a non-FISTS member: 2 points.

Final score is total QSO points times multipliers.

FISTS Awards - General Information

All FISTS awards can be applied for via e-mail.

Send an e-mail to the Awards Manager with your call sign, name, mailing address, your FISTS membership number and the name of the award you are applying for. Attach your log of all contacts for the award to the e-mail. The ONLY files that can be accepted are; Excel, Word, and Text files.

* IMPORTANT: DO NOT send logs that are scanned images of your log pasted into Excel and Word documents. Scanned images of log pages will not be accepted.

The ONLY data on the log should be Call, Date, Band, FISTS Nr, Points, CC number. The Rag Chewers' Award also requires the Start and Stop times of each QSO be included with the above log data.

* IMPORTANT (For logs submitted via e-mail): Use a SINGLE TAB, using the tab key, between data elements. NOT SPACES from the space bar.

The information on your attached log is exported into Excel and checked for duplicate contacts. The data cannot be exported properly if there are spaces instead of ONE TAB. Each data element must be in a field of its own. Which means, DO NOT include any other information such as "QTH", "Name", or the letters "FISTS #", or "CC" in with any of the data.

Logs that DO NOT follow this format will be returned unprocessed.

We realize that the data will not line up in neat even columns when using A SINGLE TAB. It doesn't matter if the data on the log lines up or not because it is checked using a computer program, not by printing it out and looking at it. It just takes too much time to convert the logs with spaces in them to a log with a single TAB, so they will not be accepted.

Check your log carefully for duplicate contacts (called "dupes"). Delete them from your log before submitting your log for an award. Deleting dupes from your log is **your** responsibility. Paper and electronic logs with excessive dupes will be returned and not processed.

Please do not send logs that are scanned images (.jpg .gif for example) of your log pasted into Excel and Word documents. Scanned images of log pages will not be accepted. All logs must have "editable" text.

When you apply for an award, please send the *complete log* for that award. For example, if you have the Silver award and are applying for the Gold award, send the complete log showing all contacts used for the Gold award 500 points.

If you are mailing your award application, **DO NOT SEND YOUR ORIGINAL LOG.** Send a copy. After the logs are checked, the logs are discarded. It is too expensive to mail them back. If you want your log returned, include sufficient return postage.

All contacts submitted in award logs must have been made via two-way CW mode on the air using the call sign, or a previous call sign held by the person submitting the award log.

There is no charge for awards of FISTS members whose dues are current.

Non-FISTS and FISTS members whose dues are not current are eligible for awards, but please enclose \$3 to help defray expenses.

Dupe Check Sheets

A duplicate-check sheet must be included with all submitted paper logs with over 100 contacts that are NOT sorted by FISTS number for Century Certificate Awards, or sorted by CC (Century Certificate) number for Platinum Awards.

If your log is sorted by FISTS number or CC number, you do not need to send a dupe sheet.

The NANFA Award does not require a dupe sheet.

A dupe-check sheet can be viewed or downloaded online. To view it online, just click the link on the

awards web page. To download, "right mouse click" on the link and "save as" to your hard drive.

To make your own dupe sheet, take a blank sheet of 8.5 by 11 paper and turn it sideways so that the long side is at the top. Write the numbers 1 through 9 along the top edge of the paper spreading them out so you have plenty of room between each number.

Now, go through your award log and write the FISTS number for each QSO under the numbered column that corresponds with the first number of each FISTS number. DO NOT USE THE CALL SIGNS, use the FISTS number. Each time you enter a new FISTS number in a column, check down through that column to see if that FISTS number has been previously entered.

If it has, then it is a duplicate and should NOT be used for your award Log. This dupe sheet needs to be included with your award log when applying for awards with over 100 contacts that are not sorted by FISTS number.

What is a CC Number?

This is one of the most asked FISTS questions! CC stands for Century Certificate.

There is a unique, sequentially-issued number on your Basic Century Award. This number is your Century Certificate number, commonly referred to as your CC number. This number, like your FISTS number, remains assigned to you no matter what - if your dues lapse, when you rejoin the club your FISTS number and CC number (and any other award numbers) are reactivated. They are never assigned to anyone else, and, with the exception of a club number, the number should not be given out by anyone else.

People exchange CC numbers on the air because the Platinum Awards are earned by "collecting" them. You need not have a CC number to collect CC numbers and earn a Platinum Award, but it makes it more fun if you can give one out, too.

The Century Award Series

IMPORTANT TO REMEMBER: A FISTS number can only be counted once.

YOU don't have to be a FISTS member at the time of the contact, but THE PERSON you are claiming for award points must have a FISTS number AT THE TIME OF THE CONTACT. For example, if you have a QSO with someone who is not a FISTS member, but they join FISTS after the QSO, you must work them again for credit. You cannot count the QSO you had before they joined FISTS toward most FISTS awards (check the requirements for each individual award for details).

The person you contact does not have to be an active member at the time of your contact. Their number still counts. It would be impossible for our Awards Manager to cross-check dates of renewals with the contact dates, so we make it simple and say "everyone counts." We would hope that if someone cares enough to give out their FISTS number on the air, they will care enough to support the club, but their number counts regardless whether they are a member in good standing or not. You are only cheating yourself if you take advantage of a loophole or don't complete the awards the way you're supposed to.

A QSL card is not needed to claim the contact for Century Awards. A worksheet is available in PDF format (you need the FREE Adobe Reader to view/use it). Use it to help keep track of stations worked, and it can be used for ALL of the Century Awards. It can be downloaded from the fists web page.

Basic Century Award

The Century Award is earned by working 100 points of FISTS members. FISTS who are operating from the same country that you are in are worth one point. FISTS operating from a different country, as defined by DXCC rules, are worth two points. FISTS-affiliated club stations are worth three points.

The following FISTS National Club Stations are worth 5 points towards FISTS awards;

GXØIPX #1, ZL6FF #9600, VK2FDU #9610, KNØWCW #10,000, and JL3YMV #15000

Silver Century Award

The Silver Century Award has the same rules as the Basic Century and is for a total of 250 points. Points used to claim the Basic Century may be used toward the Silver Century Award. Send a log showing all 250 points used for the Silver Award.

Gold Century Award

The Gold Century Award has the same rules as the Basic Century, but it is for a total of 500 points. Points used to claim the Basic Century & Silver Century may be used toward the Gold Century Award. Send a log showing all 500 points used for the Gold Award.

Diamond Century Award

The Diamond Century Award has the same rules as the Basic Century, but it is for a total of 1000 points. Points used to claim the Basic, Silver, and Gold Century Awards may be used toward the Diamond Century. Send a log showing all 1000 points used for the Diamond Award.

NOTE — If you earn your Basic, Silver, Gold, or Diamond award using QRP, (5 watts or less), and you want a QRP endorsement; please state so at the time of your application for that award. Your call will be printed on the award as, "Your Call - QRP".

Platinum Award Series

This award, which used to be called the Century of the Centuries, is earned by working 100 different Century Certificate holders. **The Century Certificate (CC) number must be obtained during an on-air CW QSO.** Each CC number is only counted once, for a total of 100 numbers, regardless of location or band.

You do not have to have a QSL card to claim the contact for the Platinum Awards.

A worksheet is available in PDF format (you need the FREE Adobe Reader to view/use it). Use it as a check sheet to help keep track of stations worked, and it can be used for ALL of the Platinum Awards. I t can be downloaded from the FISTS web page.

Platinum 250 Award

The 250 Platinum Award is for 250 Century Award holder Contacts. Send a log showing all 250 CC numbers used for the Platinum 250 Award.

Platinum 500 Award

The 500 Platinum Award is for 500 Century Award holder Contacts. Send a log showing all 500 CC numbers used for the Platinum 500 Award.

Mobile Award

This award is earned by accumulating 100 points of two-way CW OSOs made while MOBILE on or after September 1, 1998.

Point rules are the same as the Basic Century Certificate Award. Duplicate contacts do not count.

For purposes of this award "Mobile" means: Any land motor vehicle used to transport people (car, truck, etc.) Transmitting and receiving antennas must be physically attached to the vehicle. The transceiver must be located inside the vehicle and powered by the vehicle's electrical system. The contacts do not have to be made while the vehicle is in motion and you are urged to use common sense and not operate the radio if it endangers you or others.

You may count the points claimed for the Mobile Award toward the one and two-way QRP Awards if the power is 5 watts or less. They may also be counted toward the Gold, Platinum, or other awards if you have not previously claimed these contacts.

Worked All States Award

The Worked All States award is earned by working FISTS members in all 50 states. The station worked must be a FISTS member at the time of the contact.

Contacts must be made from the same location, or from locations no two of which are more than 50 miles apart which is affirmed by signature of the applicant on the application.

A check sheet is available in in PDF format (you need the FREE Adobe Reader to view/use it) and can be downloaded from the FISTS website.

Rag Chewers Award

This award is earned by making 100 two-way CW QSOs, each lasting at least 30 minutes, with another FISTS member on or after the date of September 1, 1998. Duplicate member contacts are valid, but they must be made on different dates.

1-Way and 2-Way QRP Awards

The 1 X QRP Award is earned by working 100 points of FISTS members while you are operating QRP, 5 watts or less. Same point rules as the Basic Century Award.

The 2 X QRP Award is earned by working 100 points of FISTS members while you and the other station contacted are **both** operating QRP, 5 watts or less. Same point rules as the Basic Century Award.

Nightmare Alpha-Numeric FISTS Award

The starting date for this award is January 1, 2003. All contacts claimed for this award must be made after this date. This award will be a lot of fun as well as a challenge. The award was created by Jack Bock, K7ZR #2656 (Silent Key).

There is NO TIME LIMIT to complete this award.

- 1) Contacts must be 2-way CW on-air contacts made on or after Jan 1, 2003.
- 2) Contacts can be made at any time, any place at any speed.
- 3) Contacts must be with a person or club with a FISTS number.
- 4) Contacts can be with FISTS from any country.

The object is to work stations whose call signs fit into the squares on a grid. There are 260 squares (26 letters and 10 numerals) 'Counters' are the last numeral of the call sign and the first letter of the suffix. For example, K7ZR goes in the 7 column at the Z row. WZ8C fits in the 8 column on the C row. P31ABC would be in the 1 column on the A row.

By convention, use the numeral of a portable designator if there is one - WB9CIS /M3 would be in the 3 column on the C row. Also put the date (month/day) in the square with the call sign for reference.

You can make your own grid sheet by taking a piece of 8.5" x 11" lined writing paper and drawing 10 each 3/4" vertical columns labeling them "1" through "0". Then go to the left-hand margin and label 26 of the horizontal stripes "A" through "Z".

A ready-made .pdf grid log is available for downloading on the FISTS website.

To get your NANFA certificate, send your completed grid (filled in with the call signs and dates) along with your log containing the same contact info used for the Basic Century Award. If you work the award using QRP or Mobile, note this on your award application if you would like that endorsement. Your award certificate will then be printed with "Your Call - QRP" or "Your Call - Mobile".

The Millionaire Award

So, you want to be a millionaire? You'll feel like a million bucks when you hang this piece of wallpaper in your shack! This award is simple and obtainable, as well as challenging. You earn it by working a total of a million in FISTS membership numbers. The basic award is for one million points with endorsement stickers for additional increments of one million.

For example, if you work member number 11500 and member number 10000 and then work #379, you'd have a total of 21,879 points.

We hope to encourage newer FISTS members to get on the air, since they have "bigger" FISTS membership numbers they will be sought after.

You may only claim member numbers for credit once per band, but use as many bands as you want. If you use the WARCs please be sure your contact is a legit QSO. We don't want FISTS to have the reputation of being the ones to spoil the WARCs with hit and run, contest-like QSOs. Exchange FISTS numbers on the air and have a little chat - about the weather, your key, your rig, family...

Two-way CW contacts only. You do not need to get a QSL confirmation of the QSO - just keep a running total of the FISTS membership number points. Only contacts made on or after January 1, 2006 are valid.

To claim the award with a paper/written log, include a log sheet that has the contacted callsign, band & date worked and FISTS number - with the numbers totaled - and DUPE SHEETS for each of the bands used. Since you may work a FISTS number on different bands for credit, separate dupe sheets for each band are necessary to help the Awards Manager verify your log.

Logs submitted electronically do not need to include dupe sheets. Email logs to Dennis via the link on the bottom of the main FISTS page or fists awards@fists.org. Attach your log of all contacts for the award to the e-mail. The ONLY files that can be accepted are; Excel, Word, and Text files. Put FISTS in the title of your email.

For this and ALL award submissions, include your callsign, name and address, FISTS membership number, and the name of the award you are applying for. DO NOT send logs that are scanned images of your log pasted into Excel and Word documents. Scanned images of log pages will not be accepted.

This award, as well as all FISTS awards, is available to FISTS and non-FISTS members. It is free of charge to members in good standing. Others please include \$3 to help defray the expense.

Please answer someone's CQ at the speed they are sending and USE SPACES between your letters and words. The most common, yet most easily remedied, problem is SPACING. You can be sending perfectly formed code, but if it's all run together, it still sounds like gibberish and gives you a bad fist.

Novice/Tech Activity Awards

To encourage operating activity on the Novice/Tech portions of the CW bands, FISTS offers two awards:

One operating achievement award is ONLY for Novice/Techs who work 25 FISTS members of any license class in the Novice/Tech parts of the band (CW, of course). The Novice/Tech does not have to be a FISTS member.

The second one is for FISTS members (General and higher) who work 50 points of Novice/Techs in the

Novice/Tech CWsubbands. N/T's who are FISTS are worth 2 points, non-FISTS N/T's are worth 1 point.

Basic info will be required for the contacts to be legit, including the date, band, RST, name, QTH, Call worked, license class and FISTS number, if applicable. The starting date for this award is MAY 18, 2009. Mail logs to: Award Manager, Dennis K6DF. Non-FISTS and those with FISTS number who are not current with their dues please include \$3 for expenses. The awards are free for members in good standing.

The CW / Phone Award

Purpose: The purpose of this award is to promote activity on the CW amateur bands, to encourage the exchange of information that might lead to rag chewing and also to encourage interaction between FISTS members and non-FISTS members. It also provides a goal for those who need a reason to get on the air and make some QSOs!

Time Period: Contacts must be made on or after January 1, 2009. This is an open-ended award with no finishing deadline.

Goal: To chat with hams who live in 100 different telephone area code districts. The area codes may be anywhere in the world, and the hams include all legally licensed operators. Contacts must be valid two-way Morse code contacts made on any of the legal ham bands.

Exchange: Any information may be exchanged during the course of the QSO, but the minimum information must include Name, QTH, signal report and area code.

Points: Each area code equals one point, with 100 points needed to earn the award. Each area code must be counted only once. An area code is defined as the area code for the telephone number of the phone the person uses most often. One area code is allowed per callsign. You must use the same area code for all QSO's that you make during the course of the year unless your station is physically moved to another area code.

For example, if you work someone and they give you the area code of their home phone, you cannot work them again and receive the area code of their cell phone or work phone for another point. Mobiles use the same area code as they use while operating fixed. One area code per callsign only, unless you move your place of residence.

No multipliers or bonus points for club stations. Everyone is worth one point.

Log Submission: A dupe sheet must be included with the log and will be available on the web page http://www.fists.org. Information to be included on the award log submission is Date of contact, Name, RST, QTH and area code. Awards can be postal mailed to Dennis K6DF, 4658 Capitan Dr, Fremont CA 94536-5448. Contact Dennis via fistsawards@fists.org for information on emailing logs to him.

Certificates will be issued free of charge to FISTS members. Non-FISTS members, including those whose memberships are not in good standing meaning you haven't paid your dues and your membership has lapsed at the time of application) please include \$4 to cover the cost of the certificate, envelope and postage. Good luck and have fun!

The FISTS Military Appreciation Award

The North American FISTS CW Club announces a new operating achievement award, the USA FISTS Military Appreciation Award. To earn the award, make 2-way CW QSOs with 100 FISTS members who are U.S. military veterans or currently serving in the U.S. military.

Logs must include the following QSO information for the station worked:

Call, Name, Date, Band, FISTS Number, and Branch of Military Service.

Each FISTS number may be worked only once for one point. Remember, it is the FISTS NUMBER that counts, not the callsign. If a person changes their call, you cannot work them again for credit, because they will still have the same FISTS number.

The award may be earned by anyone, FISTS and non-FISTS. The award is free, including postage, to current FISTS members who submit qualified logs. Those who are not FISTS members or are not FISTS members in good standing must include \$3 cash, check payable to FISTS, or paypal to fists@tir.com to defray the expense of the certificate and postage.

This is an open-ended award with no closing date, but contacts must be made on or after January 15, 2010. Contacts may be made on any legal CW band. Since the military record of FISTS members is not in the database, it is hoped that this award will encourage rag-chewing. If contacts are made on the WARC bands, please do it during a QSO and not in a "number chasing" manner.

To submit your log via email, send an e-mail to Awards Manager, K6DF, at fistsawards@fists.org with your call sign, name and address, FISTS membership number, and the name of the award you are applying for. Attach your log of all contacts for the award to the e-mail. The ONLY files that can be accepted are; Excel, Word, and Text files. DO NOT send logs that are scanned images (jpg) of your log pasted into Excel and Word documents.

If you are mailing your award application to K6DF via his callbook address, do not send your original log; send a copy.

FISTS USA Club Call Certificates

There are two FISTS USA Club Call certificates: The KN0WCW Operator and The KN0WCW Operator Achievement Award.

The KN0WCW Operator Certificate is earned by making a minimum total of 10 CW contacts per day, with FISTS or non-FISTS stations, during scheduled use of the FISTS USA club call during the time you are the Control Operator of the call. 30M 10.118 mhz

Example: If you signed up to use the club call KN0WCW for 5 days, you must make a minimum total of 50 QSOs with the club call in order to qualify for the Operator Certificate. These 50 contacts may be spread out over the 5 days in any manner. Sent your paper club call log within 15 days to:

FISTS USA Club Call (KN0WCW) Achievement Certificate

There are two options to obtain the Achievement Certificate:

Option 1. Contact the FISTS USA Club Call once each month of the calendar year. (Total of 12 QSOs) Example: You work W2YMX using the club call in January, you may also work W2YMX using the cub call again in February, plus other stations in the remaining 10 months. A contact needs to be made with the cub call every month of the year under option #1. Using Option #1, the same station using the club call may be worked more than once providing it is in different months.

OR ...

Option 2. Contact 12 different authorized stations using the FISTS USA Club Call during a calendar year. (Total of 12 QSOs)

Example: If work W2YMX, N1PT and KB1DSB using the Club Call in January, you may not work those stations using the Club Call again in any other month during the year if you are going to claim the Achievement Certificate under option #2. Using Option #2, you can only work a station authorized to use the club call once during the calendar year.

- 1. When using the FISTS USA Club Call (KNØWCW) you must attach YOUR call area to the call depending on where you are located during your operation. Example: KNØWCW/6 if you are located in CA, or KNØWCW/1 if you are located in VT.
- 2. A log must be kept of all QSO's with the following minimum log information; UTC Date and Time of QSO, Call of Station Worked, Frequency, His RST, Your RST, Name of Operator Worked, and QTH of Station Worked. A Club Call Log sheet is available on the FISTS web page.

Send your paper Club Call log, within 15 days after your last day of operation, to:

- 3. All assigned dates of operation are according to UTC (GMT) date and time.
- 4. All contacts made using the FISTS USA Club Call are not useable for awards for your own call sign.
- 5. KN0WCW attempts to QSL 100%. QSL cards will be provided to you for the times you use the callsign. If you can't fill out and/or send the cards yourself, please let QSL manager Karl know and he will do it for you.
- 6. All QSOs must be made on CW mode only. Any amateur band may be used.
- 7. When you are the control operator of the station using the FISTS USA Club Call, you must stay within the operating priviliges of your own license class.
- 8. The FISTS number for the FISTS USA Club Call is 10,000 and is the number you should give out when using the Club Call Sign, NOT your own FISTS number. The FISTS USA Club Call CC number is 1380.
- 9. Envelopes are being kept on file with the FISTS Bureau and the ARRL 0 Bureau for incoming QSL cards. Incoming cards are being put into albums by Karl, and the albums will be available to take to major hamfests or FISTS activities.

If you want a card from a contact you made while using KN0WCW, that is fine, but please ask the person sending the card to send the card directly to you. Cards send to the bureau will be sent to Karl for use in the club collection and are considered to be "property" of KN0WCW.

Hints From Karl, KNOWCW Trustee

- 1. I am scheduling operations for the FISTS USA Club call. The web site calendar is up for 2010. Please contact me if you would like to operate the KN0WCW call. Please give me some lead time to get you on the calendar and announced on the FISTS Reflector.
- 2. If you make contact with KN0WCW, the easiest way to QSL is via the FISTS QSL Buro. If you wish to send a QSL to the KN0WCW QSL MGR (me), please do not send an SASE. The operators do the QSL'ing. You are just wasting your money.
- 3. Please do not QSL the KN0WCW operator's personal call unless you did in fact exchange info for their personal call. This has happened more than once this past year. This places the club call operator in a potential embarrassing position. Asking them to QSL for a contact not made is just not right. Please do not do it.
- 4. Band conditions are up, down and non-existent at times. And, the bands open, close, and go long without regard to a QSO in progress. Conditions will get better; in the mean time patience is the rule of the day. Give someone the benefit of the doubt if they appear to "steal" the frequency from you, odds are that the band changed and your signal disappeared.

For this award contacts with any FISTS Down Under (FDU) member in ZL or VK since the inauguration of FISTS Down Under on 1 June 1998* are worth one point. Contacts with FDU affiliated club stations are worth five points each. (Currently ZL6FF, VK2FDU, ZL2SWR and VK4RC/VK4IZ.) This award is available for all FISTS Club members worldwide. However for Australian and New Zealand claimants a FDU club station can only be claimed once, while for claimants elsewhere, a FDU club station and each member can be claimed once on each of three recognised amateur bands, including the WARC bands.

Stickers will be available to add to the award for 150, 200 and 250 Points.

*Contacts, with a FISTS Down Under station with a FISTS number below 9000 prior to 1 June 1998 will count, but only if FISTS numbers were exchanged at the time.


We have our own QSL bureau which distributes member cards free as far as is possible and members may also chose to adopt the club QSL card or display the logo on their own card.
